Steven Rosen was inducted into the Michigan Jewish Sports Foundation in 2009. Steven was a high school track star who won the county championship in the high jump and was the runner-up in the 180-yard hurdles. At the University of Michigan, he lettered in track in 1971. As a varsity trackman, he placed in several dual and invitational meets, as well as participated in the Big Ten Championships. He went on to graduate from Wayne State Medical School and practiced Radiology from 1978-2006. Additionally, Steven was a starter for the U.S.A. basketball squad in the 35-and-over division of the Maccabiah International Games in Israel in 1993.

The Dr. Steven (Z"l) and Evelyn Rosen scholarship program strives to build athletes for today's competitive and academic environment. Steven and Evelyn had been married for many years raising three children who are all graduates from the University of Michigan. As the Rosen household emphasized the importance of education, this scholarship opportunity is meaningful to carry on in Steven's name.
